The introduction should lay the ground-work for why the paper is worth reading, and describe where the work fits within the existing literature. Introduce the novel elements of the paper in the introduction, thus providing motivation for the reader to penetrate the main text. Do not over-burden the reader by making the introduction too long ...

Guide to Writing a Psychology Research Paper

• Use past tense (because you should have already completed the study). • Avoid passive voice. Always use active voice. Don't write: "It was found that..." Write: "Smith (1993) found that..." • Avoid wordiness. Say what you need to say as concisely as possible.
