Responding to Assessment High Risk adolescents • Treatment should begin with care of the wound for both risk levels • Confidentiality must be broken and parents contacted immediately if adolescent is at risk for harm to self or others • Referrals should be made immediately for appropriate treatment (i.e. medical attention and/or mental health services)

Use empathetic communication, and encourage client/family to verbalize fears, express emotions, and set goals. 5 Encourage client to make choices and participate in planning of care and scheduled activities 6 Encourage use of cognitive behavioral relaxation (e.g., music therapy, guided imagery). 7 Involve patient in spiritual activities 8

Crisis Intervention in Child Abuse and Neglect

Crisis intervention and assessment are the first steps in strengthening clients' problem-solving skills. Instead of studying the client's or family's background, the crisis workers assess and focus on the unresolved problems that led to the crisis.
